 - ELA 9, 10 & 11; Global 9, 10 & 11, Math, Science, PE, Health



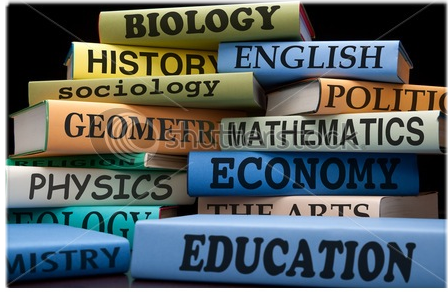
Course Offerings and Weighting

SK offers a variety of **Distance Learning** courses, some which will provide college credit. Some of these courses are: Sociology, Psychology, Accounting, Statistics, Physics and US History. Other courses offered **at SK** next year will consist of Pre-Calc, Calculus, Chemistry, and Environmental Science through ESF college.

Regents level courses are weighted at 1.033 at SK. More rigorous courses have a weight of 1.067. These weights reflect the increased demand outside of the classroom.

Promotion Requirements

Students at SK must meet certain criteria to be promoted to the next grade level in high school. These requirements are a combination of successfully earned credits throughout the year, as well as an expectation of successfully completing one or more Regents each year.

SK Expectations

Student success is our primary goal at SK! Ensuring that each of our students are given the tools and resources necessary to succeed is our top priority.

- * As high school students it is vital to understand how important **ALL** your high school years count towards your success. Colleges will assess your first two years in high school!
- * **Attendance** is an integral part of your success. All students are expected to attend 180 days of school throughout the school year. As a student, being in the classroom on a daily basis to participate is your best tool to succeed.
- * Meet with your **Guidance Counselor** regularly. At these meetings you will be sure that you are on the correct track to graduate on time, and begin making post-graduation plans.
- * Beginning with the graduating class of 2018, all students must accrue 1 credit of CTE. This credit will be obtained through various courses such as technology, food, interior design, and BOCES courses.
- * Everyone is encouraged to keep an ongoing list of extracurricular activities, clubs, and sports that you have participated in. Any honors, award achievements, work and volunteer experiences should also be included. This list will be used to develop a resume in your senior year.
